


Montreal Protocol Progress

- Montreal Protocol establishes phaseout of CFCs and HCFCs for all countries
 - Creates need for ODS alternatives
- Developing countries HCFC obligations
 - 2013 Freeze
 - 2015 10% Reduction Step
 - 2020 35% Reduction Step
 - 2025 67.5% Reduction Step
 - 2030-2040 average 2.5%
- Over 120 Stage I HPMPs and approved

HFC Emissions Projections (PNAS, 2009)




HFC Growth Patterns (UNEP, 2011)



2012 HFC Amendment Proposal

- Establishes baseline and obligations for all countries
- Overall Phasedown of 21 HFCs, some low-GWP
- Uses GWP-weighting
- Article 5 Issues
 - Delay in Timing
 - Enables Financial Assistance from MLF
- Includes HFC-23 byproduct provisions
- Discuss at July OEWG and December Meeting of Parties

Amendment Aspects

- UNFCCC Relationship
 - Does not alter any UNFCCC obligations
 - Supports efforts under UNFCCC
- HFC phase-in direct result of ODS phaseout
- MP Institutions expertise in same sectors
- MP model works in same sectors
- Implement in Coordination with HCFC phaseout
 - Interdependent Issues



- Objective accelerate action on near term warming
 - Methane
 - Black Carbon
 - HFCs
- Voluntary Partnership
- Governments, Industry, Civil Society, IGOs
- Complements CO₂ mitigation efforts and UNFCCC
- Complements Montreal Protocol amendment
- Current Partners 14 + UNEP and World Bank

- HFCs are agreed Focal Area for Coalition
- Early Stage for Coalition
 - Work in 2012 to define Coalition HFC actions
